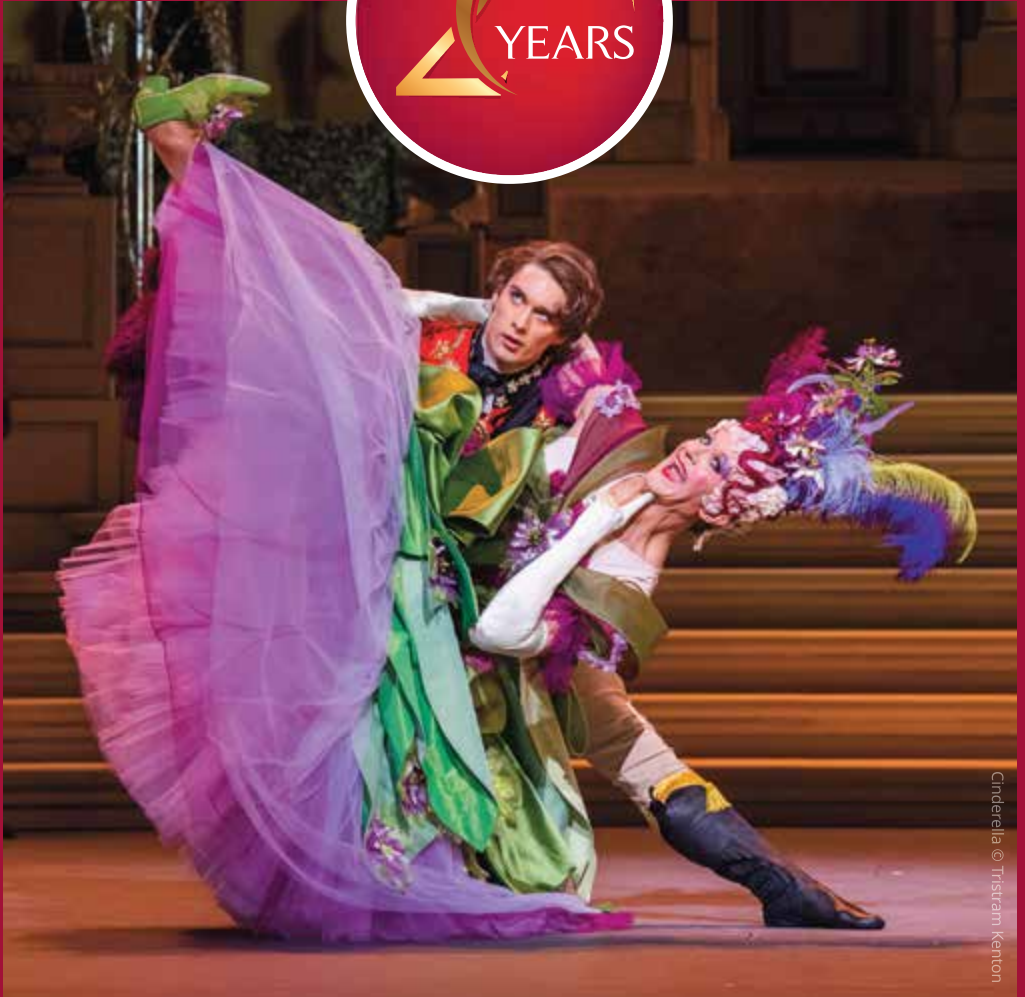

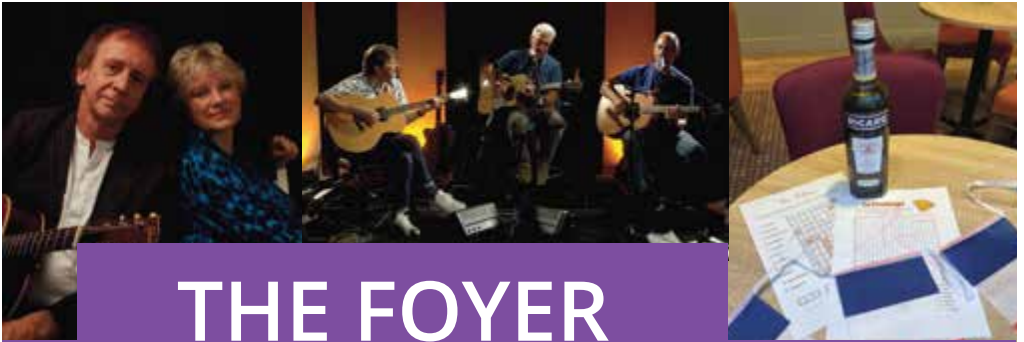

20th Anniversary

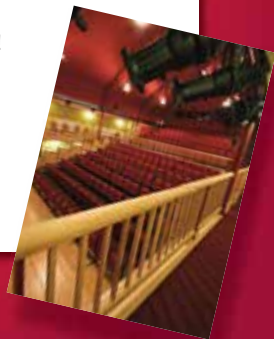

Orchestra of the Swan: Midwinter

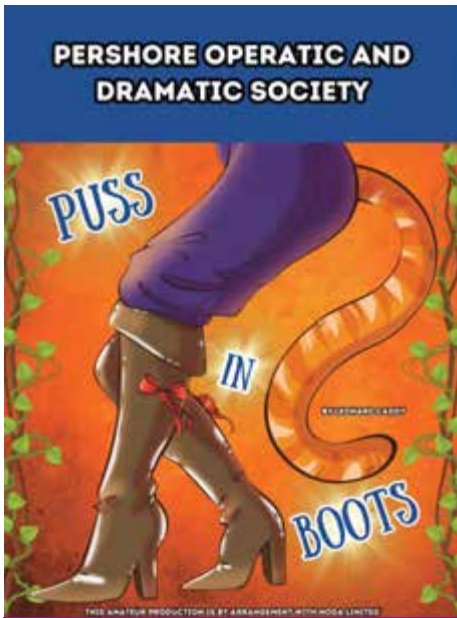
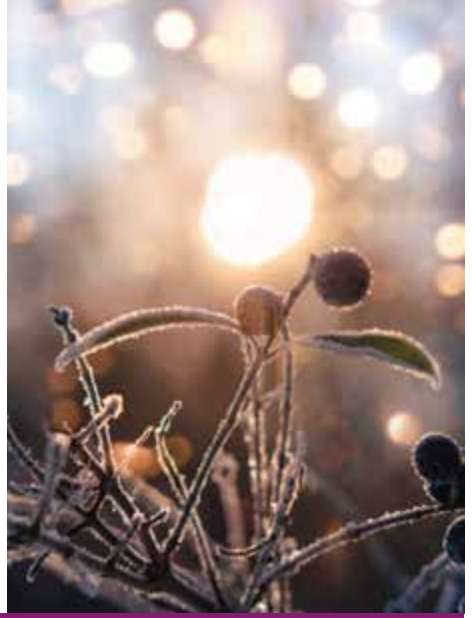
